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Text with 9-1-1 (T9-1-1)

T9-1-1 is a service available to you if you are part of the deaf, deafened, hard of hearing or speech impaired (DHHSI) community in Canada.

During an emergency, T9-1-1 provides 9-1-1 call centres with the ability to converse with you using text messaging.

Before utilizing this service, you:

- Must register for T9-1-1 with your wireless service provider; AND
- Must have a compatible cell phone. Information on cell phones that meet T9-1-1 requirements are available on your wireless service provider's Web site.
